## **Medical Symptoms**

Developmental milestones- sitting, rolling, crawling and talking.

- A child with (GDD) may not reach one or several of these developmental milestones.
- To be labelled as (GDD) children miss developmental stages within one or more of the developmental domains:
- Motor skills
- Speech and language
- Cognitive skills
- Social and emotional skills


Some children with (GDD) will continue to develop, some may even reach the correct developmental stage as their age counterparts.

### **Biological causes**

- Genetic and DNA structures
- Development of the brain and spinal cord
- Prematurity
- Childhood infection (e.g. meningitis)
- Foetal alcohol syndrome

However, causes can sometimes be unidentified.



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#### Assessment and support

□ All children are assessed regularly during development.

As each (GDD) case is unique, children would demonstrate developmental difficulties in different domains. Therefore, children are assessed by a paediatric GP to see what they can and cannot do, some children may be referred for specialist assessments.

Children diagnosed may require additional support to allow them to catch up with their age related peers, including: psychologist, speech and language therapists or occupational therapists.
